About the CE Session

This intermediate-level continuing education training provides evidence-informed instruction on applying EMDR therapy within systemic couples treatment contexts. The course emphasizes clinical decision-making, client readiness criteria, contraindications, and relational trauma conceptualization through the Adaptive Information Processing (AIP) model. Participants review practical applications of the eight phases of EMDR therapy in couples work, structured methods for conducting couple and individual assessments, and clinical strategies for integrating trauma processing within relational systems. Emphasis is placed on ethical scope of practice, trauma-informed care, and evidence-based intervention planning within couples therapy contexts.

Learning Objectives

- Identify and describe at least three clinical benefits and three elements of the rationale for integrating EMDR into systemic couples therapy.
- Describe and sequence at least six of the eight phases of EMDR therapy within conjoint relational contexts.
- Formulate at least one relational case conceptualization using the Adaptive Information Processing model.

- Demonstrate at least two strategies for integrating EMDR into ongoing couples therapy.
- Identify at least three stabilization strategies and three session-planning considerations for safe conjoint EMDR work.
- Identify and prioritize at least three follow-up session targets following intake.
- Determine at least three EMDR integration strategies based on readiness and contraindications.
- Design one forward-looking conjoint EMDR session sequence incorporating pacing and stabilization.
